Treatment Options Overview:

Phase I: Eliminate decay and treat gum disease.

Upper Arch – Root canal and crown #9, crown #3, fillings.

Lower Arch – Temporary partial denture to replace missing teeth while implants heal, fillings

Estimated Fee for Phase I: \$6378*

Phase II: Restore lower arch (implant crowns / bridges)

Option 1: Replace #'s 19, 23-26, 29-30 with implants.

Advantages: Natural teeth are left alone. Replacement teeth all on implants. May be more predictable.

Disadvantages: Remove 2 additional teeth (#'s 23, 26). Additional cost (in implants).

Estimated Fee: \$16,500 – 17,500*

Option 2: Replace #'s 19, 29-30 with implants and #23-26 with tooth-supported bridge (22-27)

Advantages: Fewer implants. Slightly lower cost.

Disadvantages: Ties teeth #'s 22, 23 – 26, 27 together. May be less predictable.

Estimated Fee: \$17,700 – 18,700*

Due to your current bite (Class 3 underbite), your lower front teeth will be in front of your upper front teeth.

Because of your history of gum disease (periodontitis), close monitoring and more frequent maintenance visits (every 3 months) is recommended.

The fees are “ballpark” figures. Upon deciding on a final treatment plan, we will provide you with a more precise fee. And, our plan may change during treatment. Specialist’s fees are not included and are charged separately by the specialist. The treatment options can also be modified to fit your needs.

Other treatment options include:

1. No treatment at all. This may lead to further tooth loss or breakdown of oral health.
2. Minimal treatment – address only areas that have decay or other pathology.
3. Partial denture to replace lower teeth.
4. Orthodontic treatment.
